

## W.C.C.S.C. RULES

- 1] The Dean of each week is responsible for, and has authority over, everything during his week. Only the Camp Managers or a Board quorum can override his decisions. The dean has the authority to dismiss any faculty member or camper for violation of camp policy.
- 2] Everyone is required to follow the camp schedule.
- 3] The use of tobacco, alcohol, vaping, illegal drugs, or crude & obscene language is forbidden.
- 4] No one is allowed to leave the camp grounds without the permission of the dean. Campers must have a permission slip signed by their parent or guardian to leave during the week. No field trips off camp grounds are allowed except to visit Show Me Christian Children's Home next door.
- 5] Immediately report sickness or injury to nurse.
- 6] Males and females are forbidden to enter each other's dorms and designated areas at any time. No one is allowed out of dorms after lights out without permission of the dean.
- 7] Campers are *not* allowed to bring fans, fireworks, any weapons, any electronic devices, **cell phones**, or skate boards to camp. These items will be confiscated and returned at the end of the week.
- 8] Modest dress is required by all attending camp. Two-piece bathing suits showing a bare midriff are not allowed, nor are short-shorts (shorts must extend to the length of the wearer's fingertips), tube tops, spaghetti straps, clothing showing bare midriff, displaying immoral slogans, pix, etc. Males are to wear shirts at all times except swimming. Any faculty member has the authority to ask a camper to change into more appropriate dress.
- 9] Visiting hours are from 5:00 pm-9:00 pm. Gates are closed for the night at 9:30 pm. Exceptions can be made for parents and special activities such as baptisms. All visitors are required to abide by camp rules & schedules. They must sign-in at the dining hall immediately upon arrival and receive a "visitor pass" to be worn at all times on the grounds.
- 10] All camper's automobiles will be parked in designated areas and keys turned in to the office for the duration of the week.
- 11] Everyone is required to follow the pool rules and the Life Guard has authority over all campers & faculty during swim times.
- 12] No food, drinks, or gum are to be brought to camp by campers. No food or drink is allowed in the dorms!!
- 13] Campers will be held financially responsible for any vandalism or damage they cause to camp property.
- 14] WCCSC reserves the right to refuse admission to anyone and reserves the right to expel any faculty or camper found to be living a lifestyle, or promoting any lifestyle, that WCCSC believes to be in conflict with New Testament teaching on Christian behavior or doctrine.

## CONTACTING YOUR CHILD

## DIRECTIONS TO THE CAMP:

West Central Camp is located 3 miles south of La Monte, Missouri, off of M-50. COMING FROM THE WEST, on M-50, about 5 miles east of Knob Noster, turn south (right) on to Allen Road marked by camp sign and follow signs 2 ½ miles to the camp. COMING EAST on M-50, turn south (left) on Rt. 127. After ¼ mile, turn right on first gravel road (Crystal Springs) and follow signs 2 ½ miles to the camp. FROM THE SOUTH, 2 miles west of Rt. 127, turn north off of Rt. Y at camp sign, onto gravel road (Mahin). Follow signs for 1 ½ miles.

## What Should I Bring To Camp?

A change of play clothes for each day, pajamas, swim suit, jacket, play shoes. See rule #8 for restrictions.

**BEDDING:** pillow, sleeping bag or sheet/blanket

**PERSONAL:** toothbrush, soap, shampoo, towels, deodorant,

**MISC:** Bible, flashlight, bug spray, paper/pencil

**\$\$\$ ALL OPTIONAL:** Mission offering (your discretion), camp picture-\$5, camp tee shirt-\$10, camp hoodie-\$20, canteen:\$10-15

**DAY CAMPERS:** swim suit & towel are all that's needed
